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### General Description

The data collection strategy of the MOBILISE Project consists of a multi-wave nationally representative panel survey of the 18+ citizen populations in four "home" country cases (Ukraine, Poland, Argentina, and Morocco). In its third wave of data collection, MOBILISE has included data from Ukraine between 20 December 2021 and 16 February 2022. The primary aim of our survey is to collect information on citizens' attitudes towards, dispositions around, and personal experiences of protest and migration specifically. We also collect other political, sociological, and demographic factors pertinent to our study. To capture any shifts in attitudes over time, the third wave has captured panel observations from respondents who joined in waves 1 and 2 of the study.

During fieldwork, Russia was escalating its aggression against Ukraine and there was increased military activity at the border, but the survey collection was completed just before the all-out Russian invasion of Ukraine began on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2022.

#### Questionnaire

To this end, the originally designed questionnaire (attached in Appendix), composed by the MOBILISE Project PIs/Cols and reviewed by an external Expert Advisory Board, was divided into 5 sections: 1) Media Consumption, 2) Political dispositions and engagement, 3) Migration experience and intention, 4) Other issue positions, policy preferences and item opinions, and 5) Demographics. The questionnaire also had embedded within it questions concerning the impact and perceptions around the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as a framing experiment (testing the possible trade-off between migration and protest).

Sampling	The survey design used a three-staged sample randomised at every stage. The first		
Procedure	stratification was 25 administrative regions (24 oblasts and the city of Kyiv); while the		

second divided the population into rural and urban areas. The third strata corresponds with 200 precincts voting sample. The sample covers all regions Ukraine regions controlled by the Ukrainian government. In total, the population was divided in 49 strata and 200 precincts with 8 respondents surveyed in each. To begin fieldwork our partners in KIIS selected election precincts, with a probability proportional to the number of registered voters within the district (PPS, probability proportional to size). In each primary sampling unit, the starting point was randomly selected in the central offices selecting a street and building on a random walk system. Respondents within the household were selected using the "each third person method" Between 20th December 2021 and 16th February 2022, 3,496 contacts were made with 420 completed interviews among new participants. In the case of participants from waves 1 and 2, 798 respondents accepted and completed the questionnaire. The sample is representative of 18+ years old permanent Ukrainian residents who are neither currently serving in the army, nor imprisoned or staying in medical facilities (hospitals, live-in medical facilities). The sample does not include the territories which are temporarily not controlled by the Representativeness Ukrainian government: Crimea, and the occupied territories of the Donetsk and Luhansk Oblasts. In contrast with previous waves of data collection of MOBILISE, there was no over-sampling in the survey design. Men, older people and urban residents are overrepresented in the sample. Weights As a corrective, 'probability' weights were estimated by our partners in KIIS to correct for the nationally representative sample.
